Historian

As our SR history proves, we may have been daunted in the two previous years, 1982 made up for it all. A region miniseminar and a region exhibit were held.

The Sun Regional Exhibit was held October 10th to 31st, 1982. The Cornell Fine Arts Center, Rollins College, Winter Park, Florida was the venue. The juried show consisted of 85 pieces which were either an original or an adaptive design. The designs were done in three techniques: canvas work, surface embroidery or counted thread. Fifty stitchers represented ten region chapters - Biscayne-7, Indian River- 4, LeMoyne-1, Sand Dollar-2, Sarasota-3, Sea Grape-3, Suncoast-9, Gulfview-2 and Central Fla-56. There is no record of awards but the judging was done by Wilana Bristow (San Antonio, TX), Marion Scoular (Clemson, SC) and Barbara Smith (Oak Park, IL).

There is mention of a region challenge contest for creation of the Sun Region logo which would be due at the August meeting. Information of when it started or how the challenge ended is not mentioned or found. If anyone who has information regarding the Logo contest (entries and winner) awards given at the exhibit can forward the info to me. It would be greatly appreciated.

Outreach

What is outreach? The statement at the National web site states "Outreach is any time a member or group of members go into the community and 'do something" in the name of EGA." Further, "EGA outreach is all about promoting The Embroiderers' Guild as an educational organization as well as developing an awareness of embroidery as an art form."

Sun Region members are reaching out in many different ways. There are several ways that are especially popular. Stitching in Public has become a fun and easy way to expose the public to embroidery. In addition to the Stitching in Public reported in the last newsletter chapters are continuing to stitch in public, particularly in conjunction with exhibits which are another popular way to reach out. Canopy Oaks held a stitch-in recently at a new branch library and will hold one in August at another new branch library thus expanding their outreach to the community. DuClay chapter stitched at the historic Carrie Clarke house in Orange Park in March during Carrie Clarke day. Several Indian River members meet and stitch at Barnes and Noble. Sand Dunes had a stitch-in along with exhibit during April at the Niceville library. Sand Dunes members also participated in "Saturday in the Park" hosting an information booth. This was part of a festival held at the Heritage Museum in Valparaiso. Sandhill Crane members stitch-in public during their regular stitch-ins at their library.

Indian River has had 4 library exhibits so far this year in addition to the very successful museum exhibit at the Brevard Museum of History and Science.

Another popular outreach project is stitching and donating samplers for Habitat for Humanity to be presented to the new homeowners. Biscayne has been doing this for 15 years. So far this year, they have 33 samplers ready for Home Dedication Celebrations. Other chapters stitching these samplers include Chain Stitchers, Indian River, Neapolitan, Sand Dollar, Sand Dunes, and Sandhill Crane.

A number of chapters make and donate chemo caps, baby caps, blankets, baby booties to various hospitals. Several chapters collect items for various charities. These include food drives, toiletries, clothing and household items, pop-tops for recycling, cancelled stamps, and Coupons for Education.

Biscayne sent off 67 Patriotic Hearts so far this year and also made over 100 bookmarks for EGA's "Stitching for Literacy Bookmark Challenge".

There are several projects in progress. Canopy Oaks has started a crazy quilt made from scraps donated by a woman who makes prom dresses for students at the Gretchen Everhart School. When finished the "Prom Dress Quilt" will be presented to the school. Indian River will once again be teaching children to stitch and this summer will be working with Girl Scouts. Sand Dunes members are working on lap quilts for a senior citizen home. Their goal is 47 lap quilts to be presented in the fall.






